Re: Scheduling Virtual Proceedings and DAC's Writ Process

DAC is currently updating its policies and procedures for scheduling virtual proceedings with offenders in its custody.

Please send all requests to schedule virtual proceedings and copies of writs of habeas corpus to the following email address:

SVC.DAC Writ Office@dac.nc.gov

Note that, before transmitting a writ, please make sure that all necessary information is provided on the writ form, including the offender's date of birth and OPUS identification number.

Please do not contact a DAC facility directly to schedule a virtual proceeding, change the date of a previously scheduled proceeding, or seek help with issues that may arise after a proceeding has been scheduled.

If you need to change a date or otherwise need assistance, please contact Rebecca Womack in DAC population management. Ms. Womack's email address is Rebecca.Womack@dac.nc.gov. She can also be reached at 919-820-7687. Ms. Womack will work with you, the facility, and DAC General Counsel's Office, if necessary, to resolve any issues.
